Meeting Report:

MAPA Meeting Gardiner, Maine January 24th, 2015

The regular January meeting of the Maine Antique Power Association was called to order at 12:45PM at the Gardiner Christ Episcopal by President Kelley. 35 attendees braved a winter storm to enjoy a wonderful meal put on by the dedicated church staff.

The Secretary's report of the November meeting was read and accepted.

Treasurer Pat Kelley gave the following report for 2014:

Income: \$7,831.78 Expenses: \$9,953.26 Cash on hand: \$17,677.01

Committee Reports:

Scholarship: This years inhouse scholarship awards go to Lindsay Strout and Autumn Willison. The tech scholarship will be awarded in the spring.

Correspondence: The Boothbay Railway Village newsletter was reviewed.

Old Business: A discussion was held on the status of the MAPA's buttons.

The second vote to raise the dues across the board by \$5 was held and passed.

New Business: President Kelley advised that for \$20 a year a member can have their business card on the website. The cards rotate on the home page.

It was proposed to donate \$250.00 to the Boothbay Railway Village. The motion passed.

President Kelley advised to let him know if any member has an email change.

Don Vining demonstrated some intricate wooden parts that he had made for the bean thrasher in

Skowhegan. The membership gave him a round of applause in appreciation of his efforts.
